1. **Question:** Who was the previous contractor?

Response: The previous contractor was Waste Watchers.

2. **Question:** How much has been billed to date?

Response: Total for 2024 was \$2,060, total for 2025 was \$1,520.

4. **Question:** We contacted VDOT to inquire about the permit. They stated Accomack County will be responsible for issuing the permit. Can you confirm that this is correct and provide an estimated cost for it?

Response: The contractor(s) who are awarded the work will not be required to obtain a separate permit from the County of Accomack.

5. **Question:** Will a bid bond, performance bond, and payment bond be required for this contract?

Response: No.

6. **Question:** What is the frequency of the litter and tire pick-ups? The contract states we need to submit our reports monthly but we wanted to ensure we understand if the pick-ups are only once a month or more/less frequent.

Response: Frequency and locations of pick-ups will be finalized with the successful contractor(s) at the time of award. For bidding purposes, assume one cleaning per month of 5 miles of secondary roads.

7. **Question:** We want to confirm the definition of "adequate safety training" on page one in the first bullet point under the scope of work section. Does "adequate safety training" mean a member of the crew must have the basic or intermediate work zone traffic control and flagger certification?

Response: It is the responsibility of the contractor(s) to determine what level of training is necessary for its crew members. The selected contractor(s) will be required to indemnify, hold harmless and defend the County at the contractor's expense from and against any and all liability for loss, damage, or expense for which it may be held liable by reason of injury, including death, to any person or damage to any property arising out of or in any manner connected with the work to be performed under this contract, or costs and expenses for, or on account of, any patented or copyrighted equipment, materials, articles or processes used in the performance of this contract.

Addition/Clarification of IFB Document

The County may award the contract to more than one bidder, based on the volume and location of the work, provided all awardees are treated in an equitable manner. The County may specify equal maximum amounts of work for each awardee.
